In line with OSPARs work to make access to data as open as possible, a data licence that enables maximum reuse of OSPAR data, with minimum inhibition is important. To this end, the OSPAR Data and Information Management System (ODIMS) makes use of the Creative Commons Zero (CC-0) licence and the OSPAR Assessment Portal (OAP) makes use of the Creative Commons BY (CC-BY) licence.
